WHO experts highlight drowning as a huge threat for public safety especially in the Baltic countries, where drowning rates are much higher than in other Nordic or Baltic Sea Region countries (Lithuania 8.1, Latvia 6.0 persons drown out of every 100 000), comparing with Finland 2.4, Sweden and Norway 1.4. Drowning is often associated with a lapse in supervision, swimming in prohibited places and the lack of swimming abilities (more generally - water competency). Childrens' drowning is both a neglected public health issue that requires coordinated attention from educational, health and social policy perspective. "AQUATIC LIFE" project aims to strengthen Nordic-Baltic cross-sectoral cooperation in the field of swimming teaching and water safety education for children in order to develop the quality of water competency education and contribute to drowning prevention in both Baltic and Nordic countries.

We regard Universities as an important gateway to the industry. We thus intend to collaborate closely with secondary schools (focusing on the upper secondary level) as well as industry representatives. We will arrange workshops and thematic events in the upper secondary schools that aim to a) increase the interest of young women in programming, game design and other creative IT-studies and b) to increase the self-efficacy of young women within these disciplines. By doing so we hope to also create awareness on the upper secondary school level, regarding the importance of
