

OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY

Occupational safety must always be taken into account when handling goods, and the goods must not be damaged or spoiled during handling. Goods are most often damaged due to impact and being dropped during handling.

Here are some tips on how to prevent damage to the goods:

- Follow the instructions on the packaging and handling labels
- Use proper equipment, be careful when using a pallet truck or forklift
- Make sure that the load does not tip over and that the packages do not fall
- Stack heavier goods at the bottom and lighter goods on top
- Ensure appropriate storage conditions (warm, cold, dry)
- Keep working areas clean and tidy, properly dispose of any waste, and take empty pallets back in their place

Use proper personal protective equipment to ensure occupational safety. In warehouse work, the most common personal protective equipment includes safety shoes, reflective and high-visibility clothing, and safety gloves. Before starting work, check the condition of the equipment, correct any faults or report them to your supervisor and, if necessary, make sure that no one uses the faulty equipment.
