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Main objectives:

- to support activities that improve language comprehension among young people of the Nordic languages, primarily Danish, Norwegian and Swedish.
- to Revitalise national minority languages in the Nordic Region for cultural and inclusive purposes
- develop materials, methods and strategies for improving comprehension of the Nordic languages on all levels within the educational systems



What can you apply for?

- The programme supports a wide variety of project ideas related to the Nordic Languages and/or networks that work within the area of Nordic Languages and minority languages in the Nordic Region
- Examples of activities receiving support are;
 - Development of methods for including Nordic language learning in schools
 - Cooperation on development of school curricula concerning the position of the Nordic languages in the school systems
 - Projects on information to the general public
 - Language technology projects
 - Conferences, seminars, dictionary and terminology projects, publications, teaching material and so on...



Who can apply?

- The programme is open for **all** Nordic and Baltic institutions, organisations and other actors, private or public, interested in working with or promoting Nordic languages and minority languages in the Nordic Region.
- An application for preparatory visits must represent at least two different participating countries/areas.
- The application must be in Danish, Norwegian, Swedish or English.

Preparatory visits

The aim of preparatory visits is to support the preparation and planning of projects and applications.

- Grants for travel and subsistence.
- Maximum five days (including travel time) with the participation of up to two representatives from each organisation.
- To be carried out within a period of one year.



An application must describe the following elements:

- A detailed programme of the planned visit
- The background and motivation as well as general topics and objectives of the future project
- Each organisation's contribution and expertise in relation to the future project



Funding 1

Grants are based upon fixed unit costs for travel and subsistence

Travel	
To and from Greenland	1.300 €
To and from the Faroe Islands and Iceland	660 €
Between Denmark, Estonia, Finland, Latvia, Lithuania, Norway, Sweden and Åland	330 €
Domestic, more than 500 km (both ways)	175 €



Funding 2

Inclusion support: 100% of all costs for additional help



How do you apply for a preparatory visit?

Applications must be submitted electronically through our system Espresso

The application form is available in Espresso

You must register as a user in Espresso to access the system and application form

The application form is available in Scandinavian and English

You can write your application in Danish, Swedish, Norwegian or English



Tips and tricks for the application

1. The evaluator must be able to understand the basic project idea. Be as concrete as possible about the future project.
2. The evaluator must be able to see that the application fits with the objectives and target groups of Nordplus Nordic Languages. Read about the target groups and possible activities in the Nordplus Handbook
3. It is best if all future partners participate in the preparatory visit – i.e. that the application presents a full partnership.
4. The programme of the visit must correspond to the applied days.
5. Think about the venue of the visit



Activities in Nordplus Nordic Languages



Mobility projects (minimum 2 organisations from 2 programme countries):

- Preparatory visits
- Nordic Language courses

Collaboration projects (minimum 2 organisations from 2 programme countries)

- Thematic networks
- Development projects
